3 (a) The objects to be pursued by the company on its incorporation are:

1. To work for the overall upliftment, welfare, and holistic development of all Scheduled Tribes (Adivasi communities) across India, with a special focus on promoting their social, educational, cultural, and sustainable development.
2. To create awareness among tribal communities about various welfare schemes, rights, entitlements, reservations, and opportunities provided by the Government of India, State Governments, and other statutory bodies.
3. To facilitate, guide, and tribal individuals, families, students, farmers, women, youth and entrepreneurs in availing benefits under the schemes and programs implemented by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India, Tribal Development Departments of various States (including Maharashtra), and other concerned government agencies.
4. To ensure effective delivery and maximum utilization of benefits available to tribal communities under welfare, education, healthcare, employment, entrepreneurship, skill development, housing, agriculture, forest rights, social

security, and other schemes of the Central and State Governments.

5. To provide guidance, counseling, documentation support, handholding services, and liaison with government departments for tribal communities to access and successfully avail various development programs and benefits.

6. To promote education, literacy, vocational training, skill development, digital literacy, higher education, and capacity building among tribal youth, students, and communities.

7. To undertake programs, projects, seminars, workshops, awareness campaigns, research studies, and field interventions for the socio empowerment and sustainable development of tribal communities.

8. To collaborate and work in partnership with Central and State Government departments, public institutions, other non-governmental organizations, educational institutions, corporate bodies, and international agencies for the welfare and all-round development of tribal communities across India.

9. To protect, preserve, promote, and document the rich cultural heritage, traditions, languages, customs, art forms, and unique identity of tribal communities while simultaneously encouraging their inclusive growth and active participation in national development.

10. To work towards the empowerment, self-reliance, dignity, and continuous improvement in the quality of life of all Scheduled Tribes (Adivasi communities) in India.

11. To promote transparency, accountability, integrity, and good governance in the implementation of all tribal welfare and development schemes across India. The Company shall establish Anti-

Corruption and Public Grievance Redressal Committees at village, block, district, and state levels to create awareness about citizens' rights, monitor the proper implementation of government schemes, tribal beneficiaries in filing grievances, and report cases of corruption, misuse of public funds, maladministration, exploitation, harassment, or any other irregularities to the competent authorities, vigilance commissions, anti-corruption bodies, and other lawful agencies for appropriate action in accordance with the law.

12. To work through constitutional, legal, and democratic means for the recognition and protection of tribal communities that are traditionally tribal in nature but are not yet included in the Scheduled Tribes list. The Company shall undertake research, documentation, awareness programmes, capacity building, representations, and advocacy before appropriate Government authorities, constitutional bodies, and other forums to secure justice, formal recognition, and inclusion of such eligible communities in the Scheduled Tribes list, thereby enabling them to access all welfare schemes and benefits available to Scheduled Tribes.

(b) *Matters which are necessary for furtherance of the objects specified in clause 3(a) are

13. To promote modern education, digital literacy, vocational training, skill development, scientific agriculture, advanced farming techniques, sustainable livelihood options, and rural development among tribal communities throughout India, with special emphasis on remote and underserved areas.

14. To support and empower tribal farmers, artisans by providing in processing, value addition, branding, packaging, marketing, distribution, and sale

of agricultural, forest produce, handicrafts, and other tribal products in domestic and international markets and sustainable livelihoods.

15. To establish, promote, and support village-level development committees, community forums, and people's institutions to ensure effective implementation of educational, agricultural, social, and welfare programmes, and to encourage active community participation in the planning and execution of development initiatives for the empowerment of tribal communities.

16. To provide comprehensive guidance, counselling, documentation, handholding support, and facilitation services to enable tribal communities, individuals, students, women, youth, farmers, and entrepreneurs to access and avail various schemes, subsidies, grants, benefits, and welfare initiatives of the Central Government, State Governments, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Tribal Development Departments, and other public institutions.

17. To promote sustainable livelihoods among all Scheduled Tribes (Adivasi communities) across India.

18. To provide for housing, agricultural equipment, irrigation facilities, healthcare needs, dairy farming, animal husbandry, agriculture-based enterprises, cottage industries, self-employment ventures, and other income-generating activities for tribal individuals, families, and communities.

19. To mobilize grants, donations, contributions, welfare funds, Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), and other lawful resources for the socio development of tribal communities.

20. To promote physical fitness, sportsmanship, health, and all-round youth development among tribal communities

across India by establishing, managing, supporting, and promoting gymnasiums, fitness centers, sports clubs, playgrounds, multipurpose sports facilities, and sports training infrastructure at village, block, district, state, and national levels.

21. To establish, operate, and support sports academies and training centers for various indoor and outdoor sports and games; to provide coaching, mentorship, training facilities, equipment, and necessary support to talented tribal youth so as to enable them to participate and excel in district, state, national, and international sports competitions and events.

22. To organize, promote, support, and facilitate mass marriage ceremonies, community marriage programs, and collective social welfare events for eligible individuals belonging to tribal communities with the objective of reducing social burdens, promoting social harmony, dignity, and strengthening community bonds.

23. To work for the holistic welfare, protection, empowerment, education, healthcare, cultural preservation, social justice, and overall development of all Scheduled Tribes (Adivasi communities) across India, irrespective of region, language, or sub-group affiliation.

24. To undertake various programs, projects, awareness campaigns, educational initiatives, livelihood promotion activities, skill development programs, healthcare services, and other welfare measures for the upliftment and well-being of tribal communities and to promote their active participation in the social, cultural, and national development of India.

25. To establish, promote, manage, and support sports clubs, gymnasiums, fitness

centers, playgrounds, sports complexes, and training academies; and to provide necessary equipment, coaching, infrastructure, and facilities for various indoor and outdoor sports and games, particularly for children, youth, women, and members of tribal communities.

26. To establish, maintain, manage, and support old age homes, senior citizen care centers, old living facilities, and other welfare programs for elderly persons belonging to tribal and other communities, providing accommodation, healthcare, counselling, recreation, nutrition, and social support services to ensure their dignity, security, and well-being.

27. To establish, operate, manage, , and support educational institutions including pre-primary schools, primary schools, secondary schools, higher secondary schools, colleges, hostels, vocational training centers, skill development institutes, coaching centers, libraries, digital learning centers, research centers, and other educational facilities for the advancement of education among tribal communities and other underprivileged sections of society.

28. To establish and operate farmers' training centers, agricultural extension centers, demonstration farms, and rural development institutes for imparting education, training, technical guidance, and support in modern agricultural practices, irrigation management, organic farming, crop diversification, agri-business development, food processing, livestock management, and other allied activities for the benefit of tribal farmers and rural communities.

29. To conduct seminars, workshops, conferences, exhibitions, awareness programs, training camps, and various capacity-building initiatives for the social,

educational, agricultural, cultural, and professional development of tribal and rural communities across India.

30. To establish, promote, manage, support, and facilitate Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), vocational education centers, technical training institutes, and other career-oriented educational facilities for tribal youth and other disadvantaged communities across India, subject to applicable laws and necessary regulatory approvals.

31. To establish and operate Skill Development Centers at village, block, district, state, and national levels for providing vocational training, employability skills, entrepreneurship development, soft skills, life skills, technical education, and industry-oriented training programs to tribal youth, women, students, farmers, and other members of tribal communities.

32. To establish, support, and manage Computer Training Academies, Digital Learning Centers, Information Technology Training Institutes, and Digital Literacy Programs in rural, tribal, and remote areas across India for enhancing computer knowledge, digital skills, internet literacy, e-governance awareness, cybersecurity awareness, and employment opportunities among tribal and rural populations.

33. To provide career guidance, job-oriented training, placement assistance, entrepreneurship development support, startup mentoring, and professional development programs to enable tribal youth and community members to secure meaningful employment, self-employment, and sustainable livelihood opportunities.

34. To promote the use of modern technology, information and communication technology (ICT), artificial intelligence, digital services, e-learning

platforms, and innovative educational tools for the social, educational, and overall development of tribal communities and rural areas throughout India.

35. To collaborate and enter into partnerships with Central and State Government departments, educational institutions, universities, technical boards, Skill Development Missions, industries, corporate organizations, and other stakeholders for the effective implementation of technical education, vocational training, digital literacy, and skill development initiatives for the benefit of tribal communities.

36. To promote, protect, and advance the social, educational, cultural, and health welfare of Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) in India, with special focus on Maharashtra and other tribal-dominated regions.

37. To work for the overall development and empowerment of tribal communities by undertaking programs for education, skill development, livelihood enhancement, health and nutrition, sanitation, and sustainable development.

38. To preserve, protect, and promote the unique culture, traditions, arts, crafts, languages, folk music, dance, and indigenous knowledge systems of tribal communities.

39. To facilitate access to quality education, vocational training, digital literacy, and higher education opportunities for tribal children, youth, and women.

40. To improve healthcare access by organizing medical camps, mobile health units, awareness programs on nutrition, maternal and child health, preventive healthcare, and traditional tribal medicine systems.

41. To improve healthcare access by organizing medical camps, mobile health units, awareness programs on nutrition, maternal and child health, preventive healthcare, and traditional tribal medicine systems.
42. To promote sustainable livelihood opportunities through skill development, handicraft promotion, forest-based enterprises, agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, and micro-enterprises for tribal families.
43. To establish, run, and maintain schools, hostels, residential educational institutions, libraries, study centers, vocational training centers, and skill development institutes for tribal children and youth.
44. To organize awareness camps, seminars, workshops, conferences, and capacity-building programs on tribal rights, government schemes, legal awareness, and self-governance (Gram Sabhas).
45. To promote organic farming, watershed management, afforestation, biodiversity conservation, and climate change adaptation measures in tribal areas.
46. To provide relief and rehabilitation to tribal families affected by natural calamities, displacement, migration, or distress.
47. To collaborate with Central and State Governments, Tribal Development Departments, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, NGOs, CSR partners, and international agencies for implementation of tribal welfare schemes and projects.
48. To conduct research, documentation, and publication of reports, books, and materials on tribal culture, socio status, and development issues.
49. To establish community centers, multipurpose halls, sports complexes, and cultural centers for holistic development

of tribal areas

50. To constitute a Central Governing Board / Main Directorate at the national level which shall act as the apex body of the Organization and shall have full authority to frame policies, issue guidelines, supervise, direct, control, and monitor all activities of the Organization across India.

51. To establish State-Level Governing Committees in every State where the Organization operates for effective coordination and implementation of its tribal welfare programs and activities.

52. To constitute Executive Committees at the State, District, Taluka/Block, and Village levels for the proper management, execution, and monitoring of the Organization's programs and welfare initiatives for tribal communities.

53. The Central Governing Board shall have the absolute power and authority to appoint, nominate, approve, remove, suspend, or replace the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Joint Secretary, Treasurer, and other office bearers and members of the State, District, Taluka, and Village level Committees, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Organization.

54. To empower the Central Governing Board to exercise overall superintendence, issue administrative directions, fill up vacancies, reconstitute or restructure any Committee, and take all necessary decisions for the effective governance, smooth functioning, and growth of the Organization.

55. To revise, modify, or alter the strength, composition, powers, functions, and responsibilities of any Committee or the governance structure through a resolution passed by the Central Governing Board whenever it is deemed necessary in the best interest of

the Organization and the attainment of its objects
56. To do all such other acts, deeds, and things as are incidental or conducive to the establishment and effective functioning of the said multi-tier organizational structure for the better implementation of the main objects of the Organization.

57. To establish Village-Level Wings / Committees of the Organization, which shall be known as Adivasi Mannervarlu Village Committees, each ordinarily consisting of 21 members or such number as may be decided by the Central Governing Board from time to time.

58. To constitute specialized committees at Village, Taluka/Block, District, State, National, or any other appropriate levels for the welfare, development, empowerment, and representation of the Adivasi Mannervarlu community and other tribal communities, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Adivasi Mannervarlu Senior Citizens Committee
- b. Adivasi Mannervarlu Farmers Committee
- c. Adivasi Mannervarlu Youth Committee
- d. Adivasi Mannervarlu Young Women Committee
- e. Adivasi Mannervarlu Students Committee
- f. Adivasi Mannervarlu Employees Committee
- g. Adivasi Mannervarlu Retired Employees Committee
- h. Adivasi Mannervarlu Traders and Business Committee
- i. Adivasi Mannervarlu Women's Committee
- j. Adivasi Mannervarlu Mahasangh Core Committee
- k. Adivasi Mannervarlu School Management Committee
- l. Adivasi Mannervarlu Temple Construction and Development Committee
- m. Adivasi Mannervarlu Agro-

Industry Committee
n. Adivasi Mannervarlu Industrial and Business Development Committee
o. Adivasi Mannervarlu Dairy Development Committee
59. To enable all such committees to work towards the welfare, educational advancement, empowerment, cultural preservation, social progress, and overall development of tribal communities in line with the main objects of the Organization.
60. To empower the Central Governing Board to create, constitute, merge, reorganize, dissolve, or form additional committees, councils, boards, cells, wings, forums, or special-purpose groups as and when required for the effective achievement of the Organization's objectives.
61. To revise, modify, or alter the composition, powers, functions, and responsibilities of any committee through a resolution passed by the competent governing body whenever deemed necessary in the best interest of the Organization.

(iv) Nothing in this clause shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudent remuneration to any of its officers or servants (not being members) or to any other person (not being member), in return for any services actually rendered to the company.

(v) Nothing in these clauses (iii) and (iv) shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudence remuneration to any of its members in return for any services (not being services of a kind which are required to be rendered by a member), actually rendered to the company

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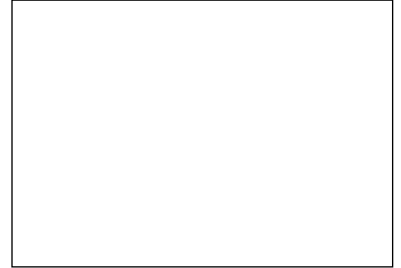

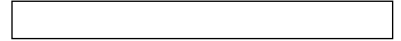
